

Regulations of incentive fee for research publication in Asia University

1. The author of a published research article must be a full or an adjunct faculty currently enrolled in Asia University or Asia University Hospital.
2. Author affiliation shown in that article must have name of department author enrolled, Asia University or Asia University Hospital, Taichung City, Taiwan. For example, Department of Biotechnology, Asia University, Taiwan.
3. The published research article has been included in Scopus.
4. The incentive fee must be applied within two years after that article is officially published.
5. The incentive fee of one article could be applied only once by one author.
6. The incentive fee for an original article published in Science Citation Index (SCI) journals is awarded according to the accumulated points from $C \times J \times A$, in which “C” means full research article, and C value is 3. The values for “J” and “A” are as follows. The incentive fee (NT dollars) is equal to $400 \times$ final accumulated points. If the article is published in Social Sciences Citation Index (SSCI) journals, the accumulated points could increase 20%.
7. The Science Citation Index (SCI) and Social Sciences Citation Index (SSCI) are citation index originally produced by the Institute for Scientific Information (ISI). It is now owned by Clarivate Analytics (previously the Intellectual Property and Science business of Thomson Reuters). The index is made available online through different platforms, such as the Web of Science and SciSearch.
